Talking Points for Nazimeen/Murabbiyan Atfal

These are some points provided so that Nazimeen and Murabbiyan Atfal have a minimal idea of the message and theme of the class.

- As the Holy Prophet (saw) has said: "The happiness of God lies in the happiness of parents and God is also unhappy when parents are unhappy."
- Your parents have due rights, and one must fulfill them in Islam.
- Don't even utter 'Uff' to your parents
- Huzoor (aba) advised to children not to react on an impulse towards your parents when told something, the approach should be to listen, patience and make a judgement taking consideration that your parents advice is correct or not.
- The Promised Messiah (as) said: "Once our daughter had cholera. At home, my wife would take all her vomit and such on her hands. The mother is the child's partner in all sufferings. This is a natural love that no other love can compete with.
- Respecting elders is an obligation, never be rude.

Slide 2

Pose the question to Atfal and receive answers: What does Islam say about respecting our parents?

Slide 3

Read out the scenario and pose the question to Atfal

- *Note to take in, The Quran commands not even saying 'Uff' back to your parents.*

Slide 4

Read out the translation of the verses presented.

Slide 5

These are all points to be taken from the selected verses of the Holy Quran just read in the previous slides.

Slide 6

Read the content of the slide, explain that displeasing your parents in the sight of Allah is a bad deed. Therefore, it is essential to always be kind and listen to your parents.

Slide 7

Read the content in the slide about the saying of the Promised Messiah (as), emphasizing the importance of being dutiful towards your parents. Help your parents by doing chores, making any of their difficulties easy for them, and serve them.

Slide 8

Very important Hadith of the Holy Prophet (saw), have each Tifl read out one and take turns. Make sure they understand its importance:

- The most righteous act in the sight of Allah is taking care of your parents*
- Take care of your mother as paradise is in her feet, one companion never met the Holy Prophet (saw) because he had to take care of his mother and couldn't leave her.*
- The Holy Prophet (saw) cursed those who didn't take care of their parents in their old age*

Slide 9

Pose the question to Atfal and receive answers.

- What is the most Beneficial advice you got from your parents?*

Slide 10

Read the slide, the most beneficial advice that Huzoor (aba) got from his parents.

Slide 11

Have a Tifl read out the narration by the Holy Prophet (saw), It is important to learn from this that you should be there for your parents when they are in need of you.

Slide 12

Pose the question to Atfal: What should you do if your parents tell you to do something you don't like?

Slide 13

Play the video of Huzoor (aba) answering this question.

Slide 14

Read the narration of the Hadith and pose the question to the question to Atfal

- *Answer: Your mother*

Slide 15

Pose the question to Atfal (note this is a Hadith) and receive their answers

- *Answer: Your mother*

Slide 16

Read the content: Ask Atfal who is Amma Jan (ra)? and mention how much your mother loves you and what she is willing to go through for you.

Read the Hadith

Slide 18

Pose the question to Atfal:

رَّبِّ ارْحَمْهُمَا كَمَا رَبَّيْتَانِي صَغِيرًا

“My Lord, have mercy upon them as they brought me up when I was small.”

Slide 19 and 20

Read the Hadith and narration of the Promised Messiah (as) highlighting respect to elders.

Slide 21

Pose the question to Atfal and receive their answers

Game: “My Respect Story” Activity

Take Away: Each Tifl shares one personal moment of respecting parents/elders that turned out good for them.

Instructions

Everyone goes one by one, in a circle.

(pass a ball if you wish*) Give them guiding prompts to make it easier:

- A time you obeyed your parents and it helped you.
- A moment you served or helped your parents/elders.
- A time you disagreed but still showed respect.

Have a reflection afterwards, highlighting common themes such as:

- Parents wisdom,
- serving elders and blessings,
- listening at difficult times turns out to be beneficial.
