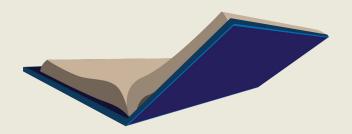

Friday Sermon Recap

God states: 'Who answers the distressed person when he calls upon Him, and removes the evil, and makes you successors in the earth? Is there a God besides Allah? Little is it that you reflect.' (The Holy Qur'an, 27:63)

'Distress' does not simply refer to one who is anxious, rather it is one who has no other way. So, when supplicating before God, we must do so in a manner expressive of the fact that we have nowhere else to go, and it is only Allah the Almighty Who can help us.

One of the signs for God's existence is that He does listen to the prayers of the distressed. As such we must bring about this condition within our prayers. Prayers are all we have, in fact it is only through prayers that the state of the Muslim world today can improve.

The Promised Messiah (as) stated that until one prays constantly in a state of distress, then prayers are not accepted. In fact this state of distress is a requisite for prayers to be accepted. This state means that one wholeheartedly understands that there is no other path or way except that of Allah the Almighty.

The Promised Messiah (as) also stated that we must pray a great deal in order to be protected. Prayers can protect one like a person who is being chased but is able to find a fort to take refuge in. Similarly, a person can find refuge and safety from Satan through prayers.

Hence, it is very important that we focus on offering prayers. Huzoor stated that there are many prayers in the Holy Qur'an, Ahadith, those we have learned from the Promised Messiah (as) and the prayers that we offer in our own tongues; all of these are necessary so that we may attain safety and protection from the circumstances that prevail today.



Conditions of Bai'at & Responsibilities of an Ahmadi

Condition 2

The second condition of Bai'at mentions nine sins:

 Falsehood, adultery, trespasses of the eye, debauchery (excessive indecency), dissipation (lustfulness), cruelty, dishonesty, mischief and rebellion

Condition 2 - Rebellion

Allah says about rebellion in the Holy Qur'an:

'And fight them until the rebellion is removed, and religion is professed only for Allah.'

'Fighting therein is a great transgression, but to hinder men from the way of Allah, and to be ungrateful to Him and to hinder men from the Sacred Mosque, and to turn out its people therefrom, is a greater sin with Allah; and persecution is worse than killing.'

Condition 2 - Rebellion

The Promised Messiah (as) states,

"Remember it well that a person who entertains any rebellious thoughts against the government cannot continue to be a member of my Jama'at.

I consider it a great impertinence that we be ungrateful to a government that delivered us from the clutches of tyrants and under which we are making progress. Almighty Allah says in the Holy Qur'an: The reward for goodness is nothing but goodness."

Condition 2 - Rebellion

The Promised Messiah (as) states,

"In a hadith, the Holy Prophet (sa) says that, 'Anyone who is ungrateful to people cannot be grateful to Allah.'

Just imagine, if you move outside the protective shade of this government, where will you find refuge? Name one government that will grant you protection (than the british government).

Every Islamic government is grinding its teeth to kill you because according to them you are disbelievers and apostates. Be then grateful for this favour of Allah..."

Condition 2 - Passion

The second condition also draws the attention to not being carried away by passion. The Promised Messiah (as) says:

"The fourth stage of spiritual progress is that which is mentioned by Allah in the verse of the Holy Qur'an: 'And who guard their chastity.'

At the third rank one only sacrifices wealth that is dear to him. But a believer at the fourth rank sacrifices something that is dearer to him than wealth—the carnal passions. Man is so charmed with his carnal passions that he spends large amount to satisfy his passion."

Condition 2 - Passion

The Promised Messiah (as) states: "The deluge (flood) of carnal passions is such a devastating flood that nobody can safeguard himself from it except with the mercy of Allah. That is why Hazrat Yusuf (as) had to say: 'And I do not absolve myself of weakness; for the soul is surely prone to enjoin evil. It is not possible to safeguard oneself from its attack except that Allah should have mercy.'

In summary, the carnal passions will always try to conquer you. Avoid them, ever seeking the mercy of Allah. In these days, many other paths to it have been opened. Therefore, we need to pray and turn to Allah seeking His mercy more than ever before."
