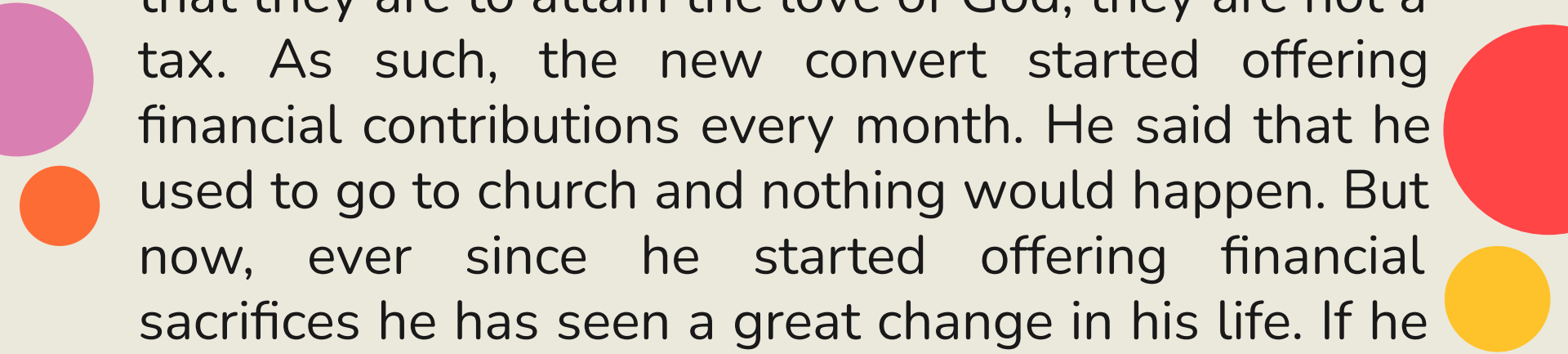


Through financial sacrifices one becomes inclined to sacrifice themselves and their desires for the sake of faith, while gaining many blessings from God Almighty.

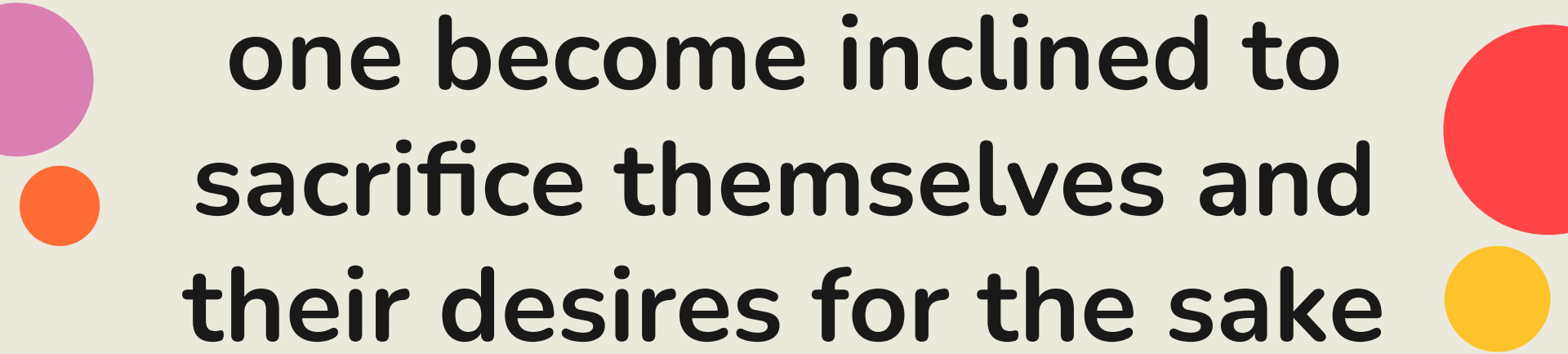
Allah has informed us of a business which is beneficial both in this world and in the next. Worldly trade only provides worldly benefit alone, whereas doing business with Allah provides benefit in both this world and the hereafter.

The Holy Prophet (sa) said that there was a person who had two dirhams, and he sacrificed one of them. Then there was another person who had an abundance of wealth and property from which he sacrificed a hundred thousand dirhams. But this sacrifice though greater in amount, was not greater overall as compared to the sacrifice made by the poor person.

Cup Stacking

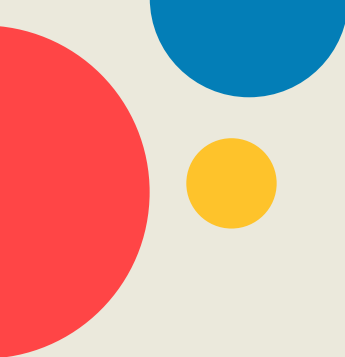


Instructions

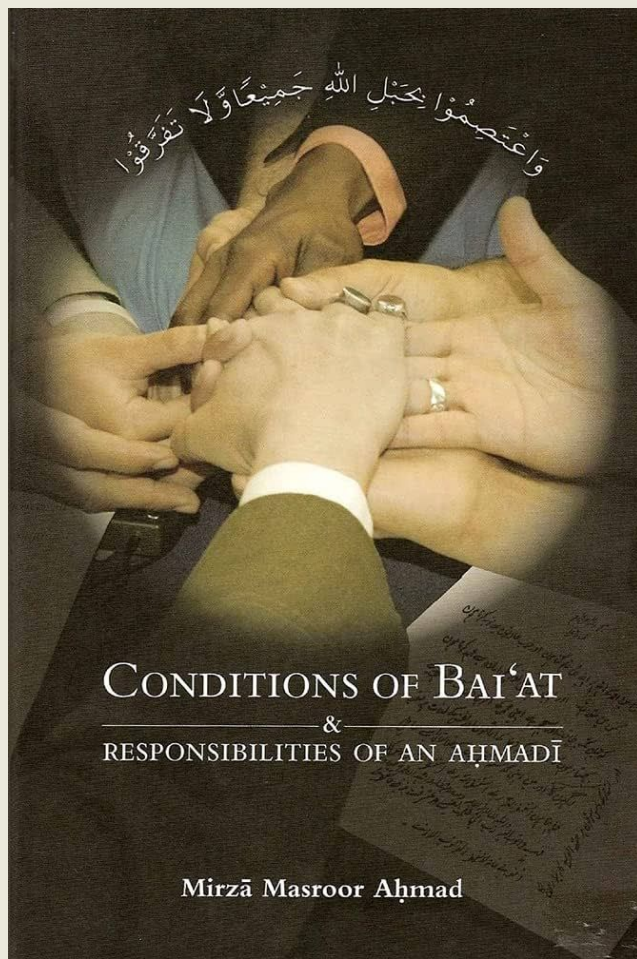
Use a stopwatch or timer to see how long it takes you to make the pyramid.

Condition 2

The second condition of bai'at mentions 9 sins:

- Falsehood, adultery, trespasses of the eye, debauchery (excessive indecency), dissipation (lustfulness), cruelty, dishonesty, mischief and rebellion

Condition 2 - Falsehood

The Holy Prophet (sa) was approached by a man with many weaknesses and he didn't think he could stop all of them at once, Holy Prophet (sa) told the man, "Promise that you will always speak the truth and never tell a lie".

In doing so, he was freed from his sins one by one. Whenever he thought of committing a sin, he thought that if he would get caught he would be presented before the Holy Prophet (sa).

He had promised not to tell a lie. If he were to speak the truth [about the act], he might be humiliated or punished. Gradually, he was freed from all his sins. Indeed, falsehood is the root of all evils.





Condition 2 - Falsehood

Allah says in the Holy Quran (39:4) *“That is God’s commandment. And whose honours the sacred things of Allah, it will be good for him with his Lord. And cattle are made lawful to you but not that which has been announced to you. Shun therefore the abomination of idols, and shun false speech.”*

Speaking a lie is mentioned alongside Shirk meaning there is correlation between the two.





Condition 2 - Falsehood

Hazrat 'Abdullah Bin 'Amr Bin al-'As (ra) relates that the Holy Prophet (sa) said, 'Whoever has the following four characteristics is a hypocrite, and whoever has one of these characteristics has an element of hypocrisy until he leaves that habit:

When he speaks, he tells a lie. [His speech is mixed with falsehood, and he utters falsehood.] When he makes a contract, he breaks it. When he makes a promise, he breaks it. [This is also a form of falsehood.] When he argues, he starts using foul language.'

All of these characteristics are related to the telling of lies.





Condition 2 - Falsehood

Hazrat Imam Malik (ra) relates that, 'I have heard that Hazrat 'Abdullah Bin Mas'ud (ra) used to say, "Adopt truthfulness because truthfulness leads towards virtue, and virtue leads to Paradise.

Avoid falsehood because falsehood leads to disobedience, and disobedience conveys one to Hell. Do you not know that it is said that such and such spoke the truth and obeyed; or that he lied and was involved in sin?"

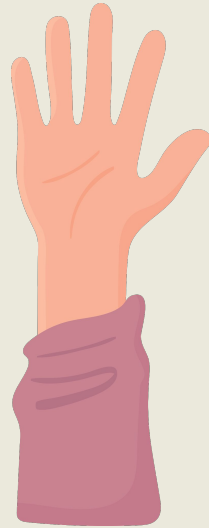


Condition 2 - Falsehood

Hazrat Abu Hurairah (ra) relates that the Holy Prophet (sa) said, 'Whoever invited a young child to give him something and did not do so, it would be counted as a lie.'

Keep in mind that for the moral training of children you should not say such things even by way of joke. Otherwise, children will pick up the habit of telling lies in daily conversation, and lying would become a habit later in their lives. Gradually they will lose all feelings and inhibitions against telling lies.
